Rundown Recap - Shoeing Rodeo Horses

Barrel Racing Report visited with a few professional barrel racers about their shoeing, or non-shoeing, preferences for their horses. Here, Ivy Saebens, Jennifer Sharp, Michelle Alley and Tiany Schuster share their shoeing preferences and talk about how they came up with the set up for their current stars and main mounts.

Ivy Saebens

A lot of people are surprised to learn that Ivy Saebens won the 2019 National Final Rodeo on KN Fabs Gift Of Fame ("J-Lo")

with aluminum shoes up front but barefoot behind.

Although improvements have been made to the ground at Las Vegas, it's still a pretty mixed bag. When other horses were hopping, skipping and falling down the hind end, J-Lo made her same little bunny trail every night and never missed a step.

"I've always done that," she said. "I'm not a farrier, but that's just what I do. I ran Tibbie without hind shoes. Tibbie ran the first half of her futurity year barefoot all the way around. We ended up putting front shoes on her halfway through."

She also pulled the hind shoes on Fames To Blame ("Famey") when the mare helped her qualify in 2018. Famey, who now belongs

to Brooke Wills, won the Canadian Barrel Racing Championship and Maple Leaf Circuit Finals running with the same setup in 2019. Her derby horse Positively Streakin, that won the first go of the recent Elite Derby, is also barefoot behind.

"I feel that the ground is so different everywhere that one shoe isn't going to help them handle it all the time," she said of running barefoot behind. "If they can actually feel (the ground), it might help. It's also a lot cheaper!"

Saebens also said it's kind of mare thing

"Mares are so funny about their hind feet," she said. "I think a mare's fighting the shoer they can get little bit impatient and hurry trying to get through it, it's easier to get by them if it's just a trim."

Saebens said she hasn't had a horse that she's had to put hind

shoes on yet with the exceptions of the ones that she has to share with her husband – if they're going to get roped on, they're going to get hind shoes, he says.

She also waits as long as she can to have to put front shoes on one. Like with her 3-year-olds, they won't get front shoes until she speeds them up.

"I just put shoes on her recently because we've just started to go fast," she added. "My other one, I haven't put any shoes on yet, because we're not going that fast yet."



Jennifer Sharp

When Jennifer Sharp started her march to the 2019 National Finals Rodeo, Six French Smooches ("Smooch"), owned by Terri Lamp, was barefoot. She won the bulk of her winter run money by winning Denver and taking second at Fort Worth sans iron.

Sharp, a trainer and professional barrel racer from Richards, Texas, never had an issue with traction without the shoes.

"That was the most surefooted horse that I ever rode," she said, "other than Spirit, my roan horse that I rode way back when (to the National High School Pole Bending Championship)."

It wasn't until mid-summer that Smooch got her first set of shoes. "We put shoes on her at Red Lodge, Montana," said Sharp. "She just got foot sore," said Sharp. "We took x-rays. It wasn't

bad. We knew she was getting sore and we did what we could to stop it. I think it was because of it was so rocky up there. Otherwise, I don't think she would have needed shoes. Her feet never chip or anything, ever. It was amazing."

Sharp said at the time she wasn't running the mare a bunch, just trying to get her ready for the Calgary Stampede. They made one run together with shoes before heading to the Calgary, where they threw down with World Champion Hailey Lockwood and DM Sissy Hayday for arena record pace-runs.

On her Dash Ta Fame stallion KR Famous Tequilla, Sharp had aluminum wedges on front and regular steel shoes on rear throughout the rodeo season.

His only mishap shoeing-wise was a hot nail and sole depth problem after being shod at a rodeo in the Northwest. Thankfully, it resolved quickly with a little growing time and she was back on him in time to win a check in Canada that gave her the cushion to come home with both the NFR and Canadian Finals Rodeo made.

Michelle Alley

Michelle Alley's mare Seis Caress ("Saucy") is a BIG girl—16.2 hands and at least 1,300 pounds. While she didn't have a lot of trouble standing up in her turns, she would slip pushing away from barrel.

"Right from the beginning on crappy ground she would always slip leaving the turns," said Alley, a trainer, broker and professional barrel racer from Madisonville, Texas. "She never fell or anything with me. She was pretty sure footed, but she just slipped pushing off away from the barrel."

Alley tried several different shoes, from rims to eventers, but didn't stumble on the right shoe until she happened to catch a video that Lee Olsen had posted on Facebook. Olsen was setting one of Stevi Hillman's NFR mounts and the shoe he used was a Kahn Forge Concave. After visiting with Olsen, she decided to give them a try.

"The first time after I had them put on I could tell a difference right away just doing slow work," she said. "My first runs in them were at the Texas circuit finals a few days before she won Colorado Versus The World running in some less than perfect ground. I was sold."

She thinks the difference is the height of the shoe as it gives flatsoled Saucy more cup for traction.

"They're a thicker shoe—not wider, but taller shoe, so it gives you more cup and that's what gives her more traction," she explained. "Her feet are pretty flat. When you just trim her foot, her sole is pretty flat. That was part of it too. These shoes being thicker got her up off the ground a little more to where she has more cup to her foot, which helps give her traction."

While some of her jackpot horses are still barefoot behind because the ground is usually better, Alley has tried the Kahn Forge Concaves on several horses with different turning styles and they've worked.

"I've actually put them on several other horses and they love them," she said. "I have one horse that is a butt dragger and he's still able to slide the amount he needs to. The other horse really dumps on his front end so he handles them really good too. I like them and have recommended them to other people who have been happy with them."

As an added bonus, the shoes are affordable compared to some of the specialized barrel racing shoes that are available.

"They're no more expensive than a regular shoe, maybe a \$1 or \$2 more," she said. "Some of those shoes are crazy expensive."

Tiany Schuster

Tiany Schuster has taken one of 2019's exceptional futurity colts and turned him into a serious rodeo horse in 2020. One of the things Famous Mic Guy Ver had to overcome was the tendency to slip in the hind end, even on the good ground at futurities on occasion.

"When we bought him, he was actually barefoot in back and I'm not an advocate of barefoot barrel racing," she explained. "The risk versus reward of stepping on that one rock and getting an abscess is just not there for me. Barefoot or not, we noticed that he would slip sometimes in the back."

The 2018 NFR qualifier found her answer after taking x-rays. "I guess from all the mistakes I've made over the years, I've

learned that if you have a horse that starts slipping in the backend take some x-rays," she said. "I bet you're going to be negative on your angles more time than not."

The angles that Schuster is referring to is the palmar angle, the orientation of the coffin bone within the hoof capsule. With a Shoeing Continued on Page 6



negative palmar angle, the wings (rear) of the coffin bone is lower than the toe (front).

Famous Mic Guy Ver has wedges in the back as a result of the x-rays.

"A lot of horses will look positive (with the wings of the coffin bone higher than the toe) in the backend but they're not," she said. "We shot x-rays and that horse was negative to the point you couldn't fix it with a trimming. We keep a minimal wedge shoe on him. He's been in as high as a three degree wedge shoe and as low as a one."

The shoe she currently uses is such a subtle wedge that it doesn't really look like one at a quick glance. She says the only thing that keep that rear wedge from being her "perfect fantasy shoe" is that it lacks clips.

"You have to pull clips," she said. "I prefer to have clips just because of torque and shift. They start stomping flies and shoes start to shift."

Up front she has Mic Guy Ver aluminum Morrison Rollers.

"I put him in the Morrison Rollers in the front not for any particular reason other than they're a nice protective shoe, especially the toe area," she said. "I think he could run in Nikes or cheap Wal-Mart tennis shoes and be fine in the front, but I think changing the angles in the back is what made the difference."

Schuster says she's used a variety of different shoes on different horses and she tries not to be locked into one thing.

"One shoe doesn't fit all," said Schuster, who uses everything from aluminum to heavy steel shoes depending on the needs of the horse. "You have to be able to think what tire is going to work best on your car for the conditions. People need to think outside the box. You don't have to have corrective shoeing. You just have to have correct shoeing.

"If you put the right shoe on the right horse, it's a lifesaver. Instead of that horse falling down and me breaking my neck, that horse isn't scrambling tearing himself up. It gives them confidence."







Barrel Racing Industry Icon and Champion Breeder Jud Little Passes

The barrel racing world lost one of its most generous and gregarious individuals with the passing of champion barrel horse breeder Jud Little on March 25 after a brief illness. He was 73.

Little was best known as one of the industry's leading breeders of barrel horses, his devoted sponsorship of events, especially those for children, and his larger than life personality. He was husband to wife Benette and father two children, daughter Mattie (Jackson) and son Penn, and grandfather to Jackson's three children. For countless others, he was simply a dear friend.

The number of winning horses he raised and the lives those horses have changed are immeasurable. His program at his beloved Bar Nothin Ranch in the foothills of the Arbuckle Mountains, near Springer, Oklahoma, not only produced great horses, but many successful trainers got their start on his well-bred horses.

Little's competitive nature and drive to be the best first came to fruition while attending Culver Military Academy in Indiana. He served in the school's Black Horse Troop and rode in President Lyndon Baines Johnson's Inaugural Parade in 1965. Little was also captain of the polo team which took victories in 54 straight matches. He was later named Culver Graduate of the Year in 2015 for business accomplishments and philanthropic endeavors.

Little attended and graduated from University of Pennsylvania's famed Wharton School of Business in 1969 with a degree in economics before returning home to work for his father at the Quintin Little Company in Ardmore, Oklahoma. In 1974, Little assumed full

control of the independent oil and gas production and exploration company.

With his professional life in order, Little started raising horses and cattle on his ranch, which also featured a polo field and polo barn for his ponies—most people know it as the competition barn today. Later, a roping arena joined the polo field.


When he began hauling his children to compete at Mid-South Youth Rodeo Association (MRCA) events, Little found himself drawn into the barrel horse world. He had a particular love for the athleticism of the barrel horses, who reminded him so much of the great Argentine polo ponies that he so admired.

Little became fully vested into the barrel racing industry after he purchased Dynas Plain Special in 1997. "Dee Dee" would carry Janae (Ward) Massey to the 2003 WPRA World Championship in a dramatic come-from behind victory after a stellar National Finals Rodeo. Dynas Plain Special later became a two-time NFR producer with Frosty Feelins and Little's most masterful creation JL Dash Ta Heaven.

As a performer JL Dash Ta Heaven won the Old Fort Days Derby, an AQHA World Championship in junior pole bending, the WPRA World Finals Futurity before carrying Benette Little to the NFR. In the breeding shed, JL Dash Ta Heaven proved to be even more powerful becoming an all-time leading sire from his earliest crops with more than \$2 million in offspring earnings. In addition to his numerous aged event champions, JL Dash Ta Heaven is an NFR Sire with Hell On The Red, who ran the fastest time at the

2018 NFR for Kylie (Ward) Weast.

The list of great horses that wore and currently wear Little's widely recognized Rafter JL would take up pages. He owned leading sires Cash Not Credit and Brownie Jones. He bred and raised leading sire Bug In My Frosty. He raised futurity champion sire Bugemforcash.

He was the breeder of NFR qualifiers Flitin Firin Cash, Smooth My Credit and Sooner Superstar, who was bred in his son Penn's name. He owned NFR qualifiers Dash Of Firewater, Nicky Brick House, Sign Of Passion and Shebe Firin For Cash. In addition to Massey's World Championship on Dee Dee in 2003, his horsepower helped qualify Kassie Mowry to the 2005 NFR, Tiffany Fox to the 2009 NFR, his wife Benette qualify for the 2010 and 2012 NFRs and helped Denise Adams win two rounds at the 2006 NFR.

Little owned two BFA World Futurity Champions Aced My Bully in 2010 and Sooner Superstar in 2008—both horses were ridden by Jolene (Stewart) Montgomery. He bred 2008 BFA Juvenile Champion Boogie Woogie Jones.

Some exceptional broodmares called the Bar Nothin home including NFR producer Gin N Firewater, NFR qualifier and futurity champion producer Imanonstop Princess, NFR producer CD Nick Bar, all-time leading producer Nancy Ann Smith, futurity champion performer and producer Less Return, pro rodeo winning producer Dash Ta Please, and futurity champion producer Frenchmans Lana just to name a very few. Many of his current broodmares are second and third generation Little-breds.

Shortly before his death, Little's horses were still finding their way to the pay window. He bred Randee Prindle's American Semifinals Champion Red Man Jones—one of 10 Little bred horses that had either qualified for or been selected to run at the event. Valiant Hero's first barrel racing money earner Firin To Be A Hero, who came about through Little's friendship with the late Scoop Vessels while attending Culver, won the Jr American/NFR at AT&T

placing including Famous Sierra, the Elite HHA Futurity Reserve Champion.

As of this writing, four of the current WPRA Top 15 had won some, if not all, of their money riding a Little-bred horse.

Little was also a force in the cattle business, having raised registered Hereford cattle for more than 40 years. He also had a power than 40 years.

Outside of the ranch, Little was known for his outgoing nature and extreme generosity. Like his parents Quintin and Carrie Lou, was a benefactor of legacy. When receiving his Gradate of the Year honor from Culver, he stated, "The understanding of our past predicates our future. An understanding of the values of the people who have made us is important."

He sponsored numerous events from NFR saddles for the WPRA qualifiers and the AQHA World Show to the Ogden 8-&-Under Youth World and MRCA.

Civically, he was the former commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation, chairman of Ducks Unlimited, former president of the Ardmore YMCA, past-president of the Ardmore Rotary Club, and former director of the Ardmore Chamber of Commerce. He honored his beloved college preparatory school with an endowed scholarship and new riding center that now bears his name.

A private service was held for Little at Oakland Cemetery in Ardmore and a celebration of life will be held at a later date. WPRA History - Interviews with the First WPRA World Champions

Pee Wee Wins Back-to-Back World Titles with Two Different Riders

WPRA World Championships are hard to come by—winning one requires a tremendous amount of skill and ability, and no small measure of luck too. Many horses have managed to climb to the pinnacle of professional barrel racing just once. Some have repeated the feat, a few consecutively.

But with 60-plus years of great horses, only one has won two titles with two different riders.

His name was Pee Wee and for the first two years of the Girls Rodeo Association (GRA), he was unbeaten, setting a mark that has never been matched and likely never will be.

In 1948 the women of professional rodeo were gathering in San Angelo, Texas; tired of the lack of true competitive opportunities that existed for them at the time, they decided to form a new Association, one that would promote events just for women in their sport and protect their rights as competitors. The GRA was born in February and the new group established sanctioning policies and rules for crowning world champions in numerous events.

One of the leaders of that group, and eventually the first President of the GRA, was 26-year old Margaret Owens Montgomery. A distinguished statesman for the new Association, Montgomery was already a veteran competitor and stood in stark contrast to 13-year old Amy McGilvray, another member of the new Association.

McGilvray and her little sister Janelle had decided they wanted to be cowgirls after seeing famous cowgirl Tad Lucas perform at a local rodeo. Amy began her rodeo career at Del Rio in 1947 and soon

both sisters were competing in all the events.

Their father Bud worked for Sonny Noelke as the foreman of his ranch in Mertzon, not far from San Angelo.

"Sonny had polo horses and Daddy trained horses for him," remembers Janelle, now 73 years young, whose married name is Mitchell.

Noelke had traded for a bunch of colts from New Mexico, yearlings and two year olds, and a stout bay registered Quarter Horse was amongst them. He was soon named Pee Wee.

As foreman, training was Bud McGilvray's job at the Noelke Ranch and he set to training the new colt.

Encountering a willful disposition, McGilvray found his job with Pee Wee a bit trying but still felt the colt had a lot of potential. The younger McGilvray remembers that, despite the trials, her father knew what he had.

"Daddy knew he would have a fantastic horse or 'I'm going to kill him,' he said!"

Pee Wee soon became a favorite of the foreman's two young daughters, and he proved himself around the ranch many times over. In fact, the horse could do any event.

"We were at Del Rio one year with all the cowboys from the ranch for the rodeo," says Mitchell. "Daddy used Pee Wee to turn back in the cutting, and he and my uncle roped calves on him, and Amy and I rode him in the barrel race. He won at everything." Bud also hazed on the talented bay horse, Ralph Scott bull dogged on him, and Howard Westfall Jr. roped and team tied on him.

The phenomenal horse, which was 7-years old at the time, had caught the eye of the fledgling GRA's President. Already a fan of the McGilvray's two little cowgirls, Montgomery offered to take Amy on the road with her if she could also ride Pee Wee. The deal was made and Amy was soon learning the ropes of the rodeo trail from a living legend.

"We were very close with Margaret," Mitchell says, noting that Montgomery and Amy went everywhere together during the GRA's first season in 1948.

Montgomery made the most of her borrowed ride. Earning slightly more money than Amy in 1948, Montgomery claimed the GRA's first World Championship in barrel racing. With Pee Wee's help in the barrels and a World Championship in cutting to boot, Montgomery also claimed the coveted title of World Champion All-Around Cowgirl.

Understandably, Montgomery wanted to make the mount a permanent one so she asked Noelke if he would sell her Pee Wee.

"Sonny wouldn't sell him unless Daddy didn't want to buy him," Mitchell says. Bud McGilvray was faced with a big decision and two pleading little girls. For \$1,000, a fortune in 1949, Pee Wee changed owners

The McGilvrays set out in 1949 to earn their own championships but there was one problem: school.

"Our teachers made up all of our assignments for us before we left; we would take them with us and study on the road," Mitchell remembers, an unusual arrangement for the time. The girls' mom, Marie McGilvray, made the most of the family's travels from a learning perspective as well. She took the girls to all the museums and historic sites in each town they visited to rodeo.

"Our teacher, Mr. Hunt, said that was more of a history lesson than anything we could learn in the classroom."

With school assignments in tow, the family set out on the road and Bud made the decision that 10-year old Janelle should start riding the great horse as well.

"I was afraid to ride him," she laughs. "But Daddy said, 'just sit up there and hold on." Things briefly went awry on that first ride when Janelle slid out of her saddle around one of the turns.

"All Mother could see was my hand on the horn!" Mitchell remembers her mother's reaction to the wild ride. "Pee Wee stopped and waited on me, I think he knew I was down there where I didn't belong. We won fourth that day and I nearly fell off."

First and foremost, the McGilvrays were cowgirls and athletes. Mitchell attributes their success to their upbringing.

"Daddy basically raised us as boys," she says, noting that the girls helped out with all the ranch chores. She remembers Amy heading steers on Pee Wee while she heeled them in the branding pen so that the boys could doctor and brand. Both girls also enjoyed sports, playing everything from tennis to basketball and swimming.

Within the ranks of the GRA, Amy and Janelle dominated the competition. In the days of stopwatches, the two sisters usually ran within a tenth of one another. Both girls also decided they should be all around cowgirls and took up bull riding in addition to roping.

"We'd done that in the barnyard as they were actually just steers," says Mitchell. Top cowgirls of the day, Jackie Worthington, who would eventually own 24 WPRA World titles, and Nancy Binford, were two of the girls' biggest fans, cheering them on to the championship.

Pee Wee excelled no matter the conditions or circumstances of the rodeo. Mitchell recalls the huge arena at Pecos, Texas, had a big hump in the middle of the barrel pattern.

Consistency was Pee Wee's trademark. "He very, very seldom would hit a barrel," says Mitchell, adding that Bud had used mesquite bushes to train the gelding.

Pee Wee competed in all the events offered by the GRA at the time, from barrels to flag racing, pole bending, goat tying, and straight barrels.

"He did all of it," Mitchell says. "He was just lovable; we could crawl under his feet." In fact, his only quirk was while roping, you couldn't stand up in your stirrup or he would stop. "He turned a few cowboys a flip that way."

The McGilvrays crossed the country, from their home in West Texas to Colorado, to big rodeos in Burwell, Neb., and Sidney, Iowa and all points in between.

At El Paso, Texas the girls claimed first and second with Amy taking home a new saddle, two pairs of boots, and a bridle and Janelle earning a new Western suit and a pair of boots for the reserve title. It was recorded that Amy and Pee Wee entered 22 approved races in 1949, winning 13 and placing second five times. She missed the money at just four rodeos. Among the wins were Pecos and Santa Rosa, Texas and Burwell, Neb.

At the end of the season in October, the GRA with the help of

producer Jerry Rippiteau held a Finals at the Corpus Christi (Texas) Speedway. Though newspaper reports from the time reported that Corpus Christi was "cold to rodeo," the big press turnout – which included newsreels from Paramount, Movietone, Pathe, and Universal – inspired the locals and 7,000 fans turned out to watch the all girls rodeo.

Amy dominated the barrel racing, which was also called the sponsor contest. She won two rounds outright, tied for first in another and tied for second in a fourth. Though she nearly had the title won entering the finals, she cemented the deal with a tough performance on Pee Wee. Her year-end earnings in the barrels of \$2,671 earned her the World Championship in barrels. After placing in two rounds at the finals, Janelle finished third.

When officials added in her earnings in the bull riding from the Fort Stockton all girls rodeo, Amy also ran away with the All-Around championship, beating Worthington by \$1,200. In addition to cash, Amy took home a new saddle, two pairs of boots, breast collar, leather scrapbook, bridle and bit, leather hand bag, \$60 in bonus money and a painting.

"They used to give a James Cassidy painted oil portrait of the previous year's winner to the current winner. Margaret had won it the year before so Amy won a portrait of Margaret and Pee Wee," recalled Mitchell.

For good measure, Amy won a special performance held the day after the Finals just for the benefit of the newsreels in attendance.

The McGilvray girls won \$5,000 in 1949. The wins would continue into the future; Amy finished in the top five again in 1950 but was forced out of competition in 1951 by an operation.

Both girls eventually made their way to college and started families of their own. Pee Wee was sold but soon found his way back to the winner's circle with a new set of little girls in the saddle.

Unfortunately, Amy passed away in 1990 following a brain aneurysm, leaving behind several children and grandchildren. For Janelle, there was never sibling rivalry.

"I was always thrilled for Amy, she was my idol," says Mitchell. "Toots Manfield once told us that Amy was the best horse lady he'd ever seen. She was my best friend, she was just fantastic."

So was Pee Wee. Though Janelle was not sure if his AQHA registration was legitimate, his performance certainly was, giving him his own, distinct place in the WPRA record books.
