

Third Times a Charm for Clinician Craig Cameron, 2010 Colt Starting Champion

Craig Cameron of Bluff Dale, TX was crowned the 2010 World Champion of Colt-Starting in Murfreesboro, TN March 7, 2010. Richard Winters, Cameron and Ken McNabb competed for the coveted title in a display of supreme horsemanship and at the end of the day, Cameron, known as the original cowboy clinician, came out the winner of the seven year old event which gives three top clinicians a little over three hours over two days to gentle three unbroken colts using their own styles of natural horsemanship.

When clinicians were allowed to pick their horses on Saturday, Cameron surprised everyone by picking a small 2007 AQHA palomino gelding, WR Shining Alamo.

"He was the little ragamuffin of the remuda, but he was lowheaded, curious and brave and I was lucky to have him. I didn't think the first day he was such a good choice in the first half hour, but in the end, he made me use all of my skills and gave me a lot," said Cameron.

In announcing the winner, Darrell Dodds publisher of Western Horseman (who is a presenting sponsor of the event), joked that as in so many things, at Road to the Horse, the third time was the charm. Cameron, who has competed at Road to the Horse twice before says his victory couldn't taste any sweeter.

"Every time I've competed at Road to the Horse, I've left a piece of my heart in the arena. Now I'm getting a little bit of that back. I truly believe winning Road to the Horse is going to change my life. I am 61 years old and now I am a world champion and no-one can ever take that away from me. This may be the best day of my life," said Cameron.

Road to the Horse producer Tootie Bland said that Cameron's

win carried special meaning for her. "Craig and my late husband Steven were very close and it would just mean the world to him to see Craig win this," she said tearfully.

The colts gave nothing for free and all three clinicians experienced road blocks along the way, but each competitor said they were pleased with the heart and effort their colts put forth.

Cameron and his colt, who he had nicknamed Troubadour after his favorite George Strait song entered the obstacle course with the goal to "make a little music together". The pair accomplished that goal in spades. As the equine champion of the 2010 event, this AQHA registered colt received The Traveler award from the American Quarter Horse Association, honoring his willing nature.

The second to choose his colt after Cameron, McNabb chose a gray colt WR Turning Diamonds, which he would later nickname Jerry on the suggestion of a fan. "A lady walked up to me and said you need to name that colt Jericho, because he's going to see the light in the end," said McNabb, chuckling. Though the colt was nervous and had head-shyness issues, McNabb was pleased with his progress enough to purchase the colt and said he will use him for ranch work and travel with him over the next year and then sell him at the annual Diamond-McNabb 2011 ranch gelding sale in Douglas, WY.

Winters chose a sorrel colt, WR Shiners Flashback. In a surprise move, Winters' wife bought the gelding for him during the second round pen session – ironically right before the colt started a twolap-around-the-round-pen bucking spree, which Winters quickly brought under control.

Though all the horses made slow progress on day one, the clinicians made progress with their colts in leaps and bounds in round two on Sunday and it was clear going into the freestyle competition the race would be close.

Each competitor showcased their colt adeptly through the required rail work and obstacle course. Adding to the "you-never-know-what-they'll-come-up-with-next" nature of the event, the clinicians had to navigate a surprise obstacle which turned out to be a person sitting in a chair wearing a gorilla costume. Surprisingly, all three colts felt pretty comfortable with the fake ape and breezed through the unusual obstacle without drama.

After completing the required rail work and obstacles, each clinician had time to present a freestyle that they felt best encompassed their colt's unique talents and accomplishments over the two short days. Cameron rode to his colt's namesake song, and at one point purposefully dropped the reins at a canter and did his own king of the world move horseback with arms outstretched. McNabb emphasized their colt's ability to move out in the large arena – hitting a dead run with his colt and bringing him back calmly at the end. Winters once again tracked a calf during his freestyle to, as he said "to give his horse a job".

Jody Wood, owner of Wood Ranch in Heber Springs, Arkansas said he was honored to have provided the remuda for the second time and that he was pleased with how all three clinicians worked with the horses. Likewise, the clinicians were ebullient in their praise for the job Wood and the AQHA had done in providing the **News Continued on Page 3**

"Mr. Wood really has something to be proud of. These are feely horses that can move out and do a job," said McNabb.

Judging the event for themselves the first time at the 2010 event, Road to the Horse fans had the opportunity to cast their vote for who they thought should win the event. Combined with the expert opinion of judges Jack Brainard, Toni Warvell, Marian Buehler, James Gholson and Eitan Beth-Halachmy, the text message votes compiled from attendees determined Cameron as the 2010 champion.

Besides the coveted title of Road to the Horse 2010 Champion, Cameron received a check for \$10,000 from Road to the Horse producer Tootie Bland, a memorial Steven "Dookie" Bland trophy saddle provided by Martin Saddlery featuring conchos by Gist Silversmiths, a handcrafted Road to the Horse buckle by Gist Silversmiths, a CSI saddle pad, and an original "Blue Horse" painting by artist Henry Patton which was featured as the cover image of the event's souvenir program.

In the end however, aside from the title, prizes and attention, Cameron was quick to say that all of the men were leaving the event with strong bonds, not only with the horses, but also with the fans and one another.

"You won't find a bigger gentleman that Richard Winters and you won't find someone with a bigger heart than Ken McNabb. They impressed me with not only their horsemanship but also their demeanor. I would do anything for these guys and will always be close to them, it's a cowboy brotherhood that we'll always carry with us," said Cameron. - Courtesy roadtothehorse.com

Alberta Sports Hall of Fame to Induct Jerri Duce Phillips

CALGARY, AB – Ten individuals have been named for induction this year into the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame, and include nine-time Canadian barrel racing champion and well-known trick rider Jerri Duce Phillips.

Phillips started her domination of the Canadian barrel racing circuit in 1964, and won her first Canadian championship when she was just 12 years old. She was also the first Canadian to qualify for the National Finals Rodeo in 1975, and competed at the event again in 1976 and 1977.

Beginning her trick riding career at the tender age of nine, Phillips and her sister Joy traveled the world as The Flying Duces, even performing at the 1967 International and Universal Exposition (Expo) in Montreal, Que., and at the 1988 Olympics in Calgary, Alta.

As the result of her success as a barrel racer and trick rider, she was the first woman to be honoured by the Canadian Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame, and was inducted in 1997.

These days, Jerri, runs a trick riding school near Carseland, Alta., which she established in 2003. She also trains barrel horses, and occasionally works as a stunt performer in the film industry.

She will be inducted at the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame's annual ceremony later this spring. Canadian Rodeo News will have more on this story in April's issue. - Courtesy of CPRA





What I Took...Out of Africa

Veteran barrel racing instructor Sue Bologna gives us the lowdown on her 2009 horseback tour of South Africa.

I first met Dr. Barbara Baker five years ago, when she approached me with an overwhelming desire to barrel race.

Since she was President and CEO of the Pittsburgh Zoo and the mother of seven children, I wondered how she would find the time for riding instruction. But she did, somehow, and has since become both an accomplished rider and one of my dearest friends. When she invited me along with her daughter, Casey (also a student and winning barrel racer) to South Africa for the journey of a lifetime, I didn't hesitate to accept. Well, to be honest, we were a bit apprehensive because of the unrest in Zimbabwe and the distance we would be from our families.

But we "cowgirled up" and on Jan. 3, 2009, we departed for nine days of the most exciting game-viewing in Africa. Did I mention that we would be spending most of our time on the back of a horse?

We arrived in Johannesburg almost 24 hours after leaving Pittsburgh. From there, we traveled three hours north to the Waterberg Plateau and our final destination – the Ants Hill Reserve. Built on a gorge, the open-air, thatched-roof lodge blended into the 7,000plus acres of surrounding bush and became a friendly home to the three of us and other nine guests.

Most of our riding was done in the early morning and evening, since the temperatures soared into the mid-90s during afternoon hours. My equine partner was a 16.2-hand, 5-year-old Thoroughbred-cross mare named Saloon.

Although she was reserved for the most experienced riders, she was soft through her face and body, responsive, and proved to be a reliable companion. We rode in comfortable Maclellan saddles that were made for long hours on horses, and used English snaffle bits with martingales.

Sam and LeAnn were our trail guides and loved riding with real cowgirls that have the "need for speed." We were able to gallop along the open plains for as long as eight minutes at a time – sometimes with a herd of zebras at our side.

From the backs of our horses, we were able to get close to a variety of wildlife, including white rhino with their young, zebra, giraffe, warthog, wildebeest, waterbuck, kudu, blesbock and eland. And at the end of evening rides, we were treated to "sundowners" (Happy Hour in the bush) while viewing the most spectacular sunsets we'd ever seen.

When we weren't horseback, we spent time exploring by Jeep and dining with new friends (many from the U.K.) in the main lodge or around a campfire under a starlit sky.

Our final journey was a ride through the bush on elephants. My 10,000-pound bull elephant, Mickey, had a habit of devouring large branches while I enjoyed the bird's-eye view from his back, some 16 feet off the ground.

I had to rethink my plan for dismounting when he got down on his front end to dig in a hole! Lucky for me, the gentle giant is a prey animal and decided to return to all fours after a few minutes of play. Thank you, tembo rafiki (elephant friend)!

I just hope that my story serves as a reminder to barrel racers everywhere how fortunate we are to be able to discover Mother Nature's many treasures from the back of a horse.

Let's strive to quit overtraining in the confines of our arenas and ride out through the cornfields and forests; along the ocean's surf and the dusty plains. Our souls and those of our horses will be better for it.

Thanks again to my "rafiki" ("friend" in Swahili). And for the blessings of Barbara and Casey and the many beautiful people I've come to call my friends because of our common love of the horse, I'm forever grateful.





People have pondered the essence of communication between horse and human since the brink of time. In the "old days" horse wranglers were necessary to break the wily beasts to harness and saddle as the beasts of burden were the only source of horsepower. Today as the real horsepower has been replaced by the mechanical kind and the horse has become a toy instead of a tool, horse

wranglers have evolved into horse whisperers. A whole industry has been born from the inquiring minds of humans trying to better understand and communicate with their equine partners. Whether we "grew up" with horses or were introduced to them later in life, we all had to pay our dues and learn the ropes.

Our teachers; the kid down the road, Grandpa, Pat Parelli, or ourselves through trial and error, taught us that some actions will get our foot stomped while others might result in serious injury. Our job as responsible individuals is to interact with our horses in ways that are enjoyable and safe to all entities involved.

Perhaps that interaction led us down the path to competition and barrel racing became our passion. Once we entered the realm of competition in a timed event, the communica-

tion between horse and rider became an art. When thousandths of a second can determine winning and losing there is no room for misunderstanding.

We choose saddles, bridles, bits, and reins that will allow for the best communication with our horse. We even fine tune that communication by seat size, length of stirrup, type of bit, and rein

length. But what happens when our lines of communication fail All hell breaks loose for some while others merely experience a hiccup. I would say equipment failure is the primary reason for barrel racing mishaps.

Your equipment is vital in controlling and protecting your horse so when something breaks or doesn't work as expected communi-



cation is diminished. Sometimes you can still salvage the run and at least get a time, sometimes the best you can do is to save your own life. People depend on that intricate piece of steel in their horses' mouth or across their nose to control the 1000+ pounds of horseflesh beneath them. Pulling on the reins seems to be a smart thing to do when things are getting out of control but, what if the malfunctioning piece of equipment is somewhere between your hands and your horses' mouth?

It's amazing how fast we can process thoughts. In my case two things usually run through my mind ... "Can I pull this off and win something?" and ... "I wonder how bad this is gonna hurt?"

I haven't been in a lot of barrel racing wrecks but I've had a few. Some were my own fault from total lack of communication with my horse and a couple were caused by equipment malfunction. Bay City last week was equipment failure, as in Dolly's bit broke and she spit it out between the first and second barrel. I was left with nothing but the parachute cord chin strap

Rocket Wrangler Had a Mind to Run

Long overshadowed by his son Dash For Cash, Rocket Wrangler will receive his due, when he is inducted into the AQHA Hall of Fame on March 7, at the association's annual convention in Kissimmee, FL.

In 1970, when the distance for the All American Futurity was 400 yards, Rocket Wrangler won the then world's richest horse race to become the first horse in history to conquer both the All American and Rainbow Futurities. He would also become the highest money earner of 1970 and the champion 2-year-old colt.

"Rocket Wrangler was a horse that had a great mind," said C.W. "Bubba" Cascio, who trained both Rocket Wrangler and Dash For Cash, as well as Rocket Wrangler's record-setting dam, Go Galla Go. It was Cascio who advised Thayer Hobson to breed Go Galla Go to former Thoroughbred sprinter Rocket Bar.

"Go Galla Go had a lot of run on her mind and she was a great

around her neck attached to a set of pretty worthless reins.

She turned a decent enough second barrel and I actually thought I could salvage a money winning run if she'd turn the third. No such luck. I could feel her getting out of control and I switched to survival mode. My choices were to bail or ride it out. Well, I know from experience that hitting the ground hurts so it was a no brainer, I was along for the ride. My mind went into overdrive trying to assess the situation."Whoa Dolly, shut the gate, whoa Dolly, shut up announcer, whoa Dolly, don't wipe out the eye, whoa Dolly." As it turned out I regained communication to a degree and got her stopped, although the fence did help reinforce my verbal "whoa" command.

She was shaken yet sensible and not totally out of control but I'm sure she would have reacted differently if I would have panicked. I

little mare at 350 yards," Cascio recently told me. "The reason I bred her to Rocket Bar was that the magic word for Quarter Horses has always been futurities and all of his colts would run just as fast the second time (in the finals) as they had the first (in the trials)."

Despite the fact that he was a May baby and small as a yearling, Cascio liked Rocket Wrangler and had little trouble convincing J.R. Adams to buy him.

"I knew if he bought him that I'd get to keep him," said Cascio, who told Adams about a small bone chip that Dr. Charles Graham had discovered in an x-ray of the colt's hock. "I'd priced him at \$7,500 and (Adams) said that at that price and out of that mare, he'd take him if he only had two legs.

Supplemented to the Kansas Futurity, the first leg of the Ruidoso Triple Crown, Rocket Wrangler qualified with the fastest time, but finished sixth in the finals. After the Kansas Futurity, Cascio

knew she was smart enough to take care of herself. I also was fairly confident that I could ride her as fast as she could run and as hard as she could turn. After all, that's exactly the nature of the game we play! So even though our main line of communication had failed and we didn't follow the designated course we still got to gallup around the arena!

It wasn't a bad experience for either of us because I didn't let it become one. I used my seat, legs, body and voice keeping some communication intact and whispered my way out of the storm.

We've come a long way from "breaking" our beasts of burden to "training" our equine athletes. Some people have even mastered the art of communication with their horses to the point of competing bridleless. I'm not that talented... I bought a new bit!

blistered the colt's shins to alleviate soreness that had plagued him during spring training, and Rocket Wrangler came back to win his trial for the Rainbow Futurity by three lengths and qualify with the fastest time.

Although the bone chip that Dr. Graham had discovered never bothered him, Rocket Wrangler's shins continued to cause him pain, and Cascio blistered him again, after the Rainbow Futurity.

"I'd over-blistered him and he was standing in the barn with no hair on his shins, just two big scabs," Cascio remembered. "About that time Bob Gentry came by and asked me who I thought was going to win the All American. When I said, "This colt right here,' he got to laughing. But I told him that if I got the horse well enough to train on, they wouldn't outrun him going that distance."

Cascio was right. They didn't outrun Rocket Wrangler. He won his trial and came back to win the All American Futurity by a neck over the fastest qualifier, Bunny Bid, who had run second to him in the Rainbow Futurity.

Rocket Wrangler closed his 2-year-old career as the highest money earner of 1970, with \$239,891, and as the fifth leading money earner of all time. His record of 13 starts included seven wins, three second-place finishes and two thirds.

Following the All American Futurity, J.R. Adams sold half-interest in his colt to B.F. Phillips Jr, and Rocket Wrangler launched his stud career at Phillips Ranch, Frisco, Texas, for a fee of \$1,500. As a comparison, Go Man Go, the all-time leading sire of money earners and sire of Rocket Wrangler's dam, Go Galla Go, stood at that time for a fee of \$5,000.

Dash For Cash, bred by Phillips Ranch and foaled in 1973, was from Rocket Wrangler's second crop. Although he would ultimately sire more performers (1,233 to 1,160) than Dash For Cash and is ranked eighth on the list of all-time leading sires by winners, Rocket Wrangler produced only half as many stakes runners as his famous son.

"I think he was moved around too much to really make a good sire," said Cascio, who noted that Adams bought out Phillips' share of Rocket Wrangler following the 1972 breeding season and returned the horse to racing. Rocket Wrangler won the New Mexico State Fair Handicap, but was defeated by Mr Jet Moore in the inaugural running of the Champion of Champions, after which time he was permanently retired from the track.

While Cascio doesn't dispute Dash For Cash's supremacy, he does give a nod to Rocket Wrangler's intelligence and willing nature.

"Rocket Wrangler had a great brain and he didn't have a bad bone in his body," said Cascio. "I think that was a great asset for Dash For Cash – he passed along his brilliant mind. Anybody could get along with his colts. They were cool-headed horses and that's why so many of them ran.

"If you train a horse that knuckles down to do his best to please you, it makes a big difference."

Rocket Wrangler was euthanized November 28, 1992, after suffering from colic, and was buried at Royal Vista Equine in Fort Collins, Colorado, where he had stood the previous season. He ranks 30th on the list of all-time leading sires by earnings and eighth on the list of all-time leading sires by winners. He is 14th on the list of all-time leading broodmare sires by earnings and fifth on the list of all-time leading broodmare sires by winners. His offspring, including Rocket's Magic, Rambling Sallye, Quick Wrangler, War Star Wrangler and American Speed, earned \$9,407,809, with Dash For Cash accounting for \$507,689 of the total.

Rocket Wrangler was ridden throughout his career by Jerry Nicodemus.
